


What is unscripted TV?

Unscripted television is nonfiction TV. Programmes can be on any subject, from natural history, to music or learning a skill.

You can watch unscripted programmes on television, including children's TV, or on streaming platforms like Netflix and YouTube. It uses presenters, but not actors.


Ideas for a documentary

Decide on your roles ?




















Evaluation
