A digital imaging technician (DIT) plays a crucial role in the technical aspects of film and television production. You will be responsible for ensuring the highest quality of digital imagery throughout the production process. The DIT works closely with the camera department, post-production team, and other crew members to guarantee a smooth and efficient workflow.

Responsibilities

- camera setup and operation: configure digital cinema cameras, ensuring optimal image capture settings
- image monitoring: monitor image quality throughout the shoot, making adjustments as needed to achieve desired results
- data management: organise and manage captured footage, including labelling, archiving, and backup procedures



- colour management: maintain colour consistency throughout the production workflow, using colour management tools and techniques
- technical support: provide technical assistance to the production team and cinematographer, including troubleshooting equipment issues and offering technical advice
- post-production collaboration: work closely with post-production teams to ensure a smooth transition of footage and metadata
